Dillman one of 12 filing complaint against Marsh

On behalf of the people of Alabama, 12 individ-
uals have filed information in the Fifteenth Judi-
cial Circuit Court of Alabama charging State
Senator Del Marsh with unauthorized exercise of
authority.

The charge of unauthorized exercise of authority
stems from Senator Marsh's efforts to revise the
Alabama Constitution through Legislative efforts.

Legislative revision authority is denied by Sec-
tions 284 and 286 of the Alabama Constitution.

Three Alabama Supreme Court rulings acknowl-
edge that only the people possess the authority to
elect delegates to a convention wherein their con-
stitution may be revised.

The Court will notify Senator Marsh via certi-
fied mail. Upon receipt Senator Marsh has 30
days to respond.

The 12 people bringing this controversy before
the Court are ex rel.—that is to say that the con-
troversy is brought in the name of the state.
Therefore, a conflict of interest will likely occur if
public funds are utilized to defend or provide
legal advice for or to Sen. Marsh.

The 12 individuals and their county of residence
are: Donald Casey of Jefferson; William Anthony
of Elmore; Herb Whittington of Houston;
Franklin Dillman of Macon; Marion Patrick of
Tallapoosa; Steve Phillips of Lauderdale; Lou
Campomenosi of Mobile; Patricia Godwin of Dal-
las; Cecil Godwin Jr. of Dallas; Phillip Hartline of
Marshall; Ed Bowman of Colbert; and Kenneth
Freeman of Morgan.
